Working Conditions in the Textile Sector and Apparel Sector of Cambodia	This project aims to improve working conditions by establishing an independent monitoring system and improving the capacity of employers, workers and labor ministry officials to ensure compliance with Cambodian labor law and internationally-recognized core labor standards. Funded and implemented by International Labor Affairs Bureau.	Human Resources & Labor Standards	\$ 700,000
Human Capacity Development/ Higher Education & Training Systems	This program provides technical assistance to higher education workforce development and training activities in agriculture, agribusiness, trade and related areas. Funded by USAID and implemented by USDA/FAS.	Trade-Related Agriculture	26,111
Labor Dispute Resolution	This project aims to further Cambodia's economic and social progress by strengthening the country's labor dispute resolution system. Activities include: Establishing a national dispute resolution system. Training workers, employers and government officials to utilize the national dispute resolution system. Developing a cadre of mediators and arbitrators to help resolve labor disputes, and create a database to report on labor disputes and target preventive resources at problematic workplaces. Funded and implemented by International Labor Affairs Bureau.	Human Resources & Labor Standards	200,000

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Small and Medium Enterprise Development Project	The project consists of training and education in support of business associations for rice millers and brick and tile manufacturers. The objective is to assist individual member associations to achieve their goals and objectives in building a foundation for the Agriculture and Milling Industry in Cambodia, linking farmers and millers to local and international markets, and to allow rural villagers to remain living and working in their localities by creating employment through improving market accessibility. Activities include: - organizing domestic and international study tours for local association members for exposure to improved agricultural and milling technology, and more sophisticated marketing methods; - increase the ability of members to exert influence on export promotion policy through business and technical training (the goal is to increase members' ability to interact with government officials and commercial businessmen at the national level); - upgrade mill management through introduction of certification and training program; - develop an export marketing unit to manage member sales to foreign markets.
