Child labor in artisan mining in the department of Puno will be specifically targeted. The program will improve access to quality basic education for children working or at risk of working in exploitative child labor. The program will include components of awareness raising, teacher training, development and distribution of locally relevant educational materials, vocational training, institutional strengthening, and mobilization of resources for education. Program to Prevent & Progressively Eliminate Child Labor in Small-Scale Traditional Gold Mining in South America Phase 2	This program will be a continuation of a previous IPEC project to prevent and progressively eliminate exploitative child labor in small-scale traditional gold mining in South America. The program will involve awareness raising campaigns; the building of alliances among government institutions, NGOs, workers' and employers' organizations, and parents of working children to combat exploitative child labor; the promotion of national policies to address the problem of child labor; and the enhancement of institutional capacity for direct intervention to combat child labor. The program will focus on direct interventions in mining communities to systematically remove children from working in dangerous and exploitative conditions in the mines and prevent other children from entering such work in the first place.
