The education program will work towards reducing child labor in Zambia through: 1) improved community awareness-raising efforts on the importance of education for children engaged in or at-risk of the worst forms of child labor; 2) strengthened quality of educational opportunities in government and alternative schools; 3) increased ministerial and NGO capacity and inter-institutional coordination; and 4) improved resource mobilization. Zambia Regulatory Training Program	The Zambia Regulatory Training Program Work Order under the Energy Sector Regulation and restructuring Task Order has conducted two training workshops primarily for the Energy Regulation Board (ERB) in Zambia. To help them establish cost based tariffs for the utilities and generating companies in Zambia. These cost based tariffs will facilitate the trade of electric power in the region and in the South Africa Power Pool (SAAP). One of the reasons that the present program was started was that the DRC wanted to sell power to Zimbabwe and wheel this power through Zambia. Zambia arbitrarily set such a high price for this service that the power transfer was cancelled. The training that USAID is providing will allow realistic rates for such power transfers to take place. The next training workshop scheduled for the week of August on how to determine and calculate transmission tariffs and will address cross border transfers. Funded and implemented by USAID/EGAT/ENV.
