(ANMAT) Initiative	In response to U.S. interest in providing technical assistance to Argentina and other Southern Cone countries, the Argentine National Administration of Foods, Drugs and Medical Technology (ANMAT) requested assistance/collaboration to provide support in drug, medical device, and food safety. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is exploring different venues to provide technical assistance and training support to Argentina and other Southern Cone countries. FDA provided slots for ANMAT in the following training courses: (1) Good Clinical Practice BIMO Course (July/2002), (2) Drug Basic School GMP Course (January/2003), and (3) Basic Medical Devices Course (July/2003).
