Chile Cochran Fellowships	United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Cochran Fellowship Program promotes global market-driven food systems through short-term agricultural marketing and agribusiness-related training in the United States. In 2003: (1) two Chilean veterinary officers attended Food Safety and Inspection Service II (FSIS), a Meat and Poultry Inspection program, (2) one Chilean veterinarian attended a Foreign Animal Disease Diagnosis course, (3) one Chilean veterinarian attended a course in Veterinary Biologics, and (4) one Chilean government official attended training in Veterinary Epidemiology. Developing a Pollutant Release and Transfer Register (PRTR) in Chile.	The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will assist the Government of Chile to assemble a Pollutant Release and Transfer Register (PRTR). This is a publicly available database of chemicals that have been released to air, water and land or transferred off-site for further waste management. In developing the register, the two countries will cooperate and draw on lessons learned from other PRTR projects. Industrial facilities will report annually on the amounts of chemicals they have released or transferred and the final destination of those chemicals. Reported data will be made publicly available. Funded by Department of State and implemented by Environmental Protection Agency.	Environmental Trade & Standards	21,000
Environmental Enforcement Case Development Training	The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will deliver a distinct training course in Santiago, Chile. This course will address issues that arise during the prosecution of a case, including case development, trial preparation, conducting trials, taking evidence, handling expert and technical evidence, witness preparation, and rendering decisions. This technical training will be geared toward prosecution of civil and criminal cases would build upon deliveries of the Principles of Environmental Enforcement training provided to Chile in the mid-1990's. The U.S.-Chile Free Trade Agreement commits the parties to pursue to bilateral cooperation on environmental enforcement and compliance capacity building.
