<b>Privatization Technical Assistance for Indonesia Bank Restructuring Agency</b>	Technical assistance activities at the Indonesia Bank Restructuring Agency (IBRA) and the agency for state-owned enterprises (BUMN) help sell/dispose of assets held by IBRA and BUMN. The selling of assets, including banks, will free the market from the government's management and mismanagement. The freeing of the banking sector will help boost the competition in the funding of exports and trade for the private sector. Furthermore, many assets held by IBRA are directly related to trade companies. The economy will be more efficient and the prospects for trade enhanced. This activity plays an important role in reducing both current and future fiscal deficits by providing important sources of budgetary revenues and by reducing the drain of future budget subsidies to state-owned enterprises.
