<b>African Growth &amp; Opportunity Act (AGOA): Customs Assessment of Senegal</b>	In May 2003, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officials conducted a customs operations and training needs assessment in Senegal. The primary objective was to assess Senegal's compliance with the Africa Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) and identify areas that could benefit from additional training. This assessment enabled Senegal to identify training in areas that support and promote trade in general such as automation, risk management, valuation, and intellectual property rights enforcement. CBP will use the results of this assessment to develop future training in Senegal and Sub-Saharan Africa. Funded and implemented by Department of Homeland Security/Customs.
