Activities under the BTBC program include: promotion of Bolivian exports and technical assistance to improve firms' ability to export, especially in key sectors benefiting from the Andean Trade Preferences and Drug Eradication Act (ATPDEA) such as textiles, leather, jewelry, and wood products assistance to reform the Bolivian intellectual property office training and other capacity building to effectively participate in trade negotiations and improvement of the policy environment for business and trade. Assistance includes quality control, certifications, market research, product presentation, and trade missions. USAID is helping 35 Cochabamba tropics food processors comply with environmental standards and meet certification requirements such as Kosher, Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP), U.S. Food and Drug Administration, and bio-terrorism. In addition, USAID is helping 3,000 farmers and 15 food processors make export deals. This activity is in support of the US-Andean FTA negotiations. Funded and implemented by USAID/Bolivia.
