Chile Free Trade Agreement	Pursuant to the US-Chile Free Trade Agreement, the U.S. Department of Justice/Environment and Natural Resources Division is working with Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and other federal agencies to conduct an environmental enforcement in Santiago from September 27-30. This project was specifically agreed to in the text of the Free Trade Agreement. This activity is in support of the US-Chile FTA. Heavy Duty Diesel Truck Retrofit Pilot Project	This activity seeks to: (1) demonstrate the effectiveness of retrofitting existing heavy-duty diesel trucks with emission control technologies and ultra lower sulfur diesel fuel (15ppm), in reducing emissions (up to 90%) from existing diesel vehicles in Chile, under Chilean conditions and with Chilean vehicles; (2) collect and analyze quantitative information on costs, emission reductions, and health benefits of retrofitting existing diesel heavy-duty diesel trucks in order to evaluate various retrofit strategies for Chile; and (3) develop retrofit programs that can be easily replicated with other fleets in Chile and internationally. The purpose of this pilot project is not to screen all technologies but rather to demonstrate the applicability and effectiveness of verified technologies in Chile. The Parties will provide training and exchange of information to enhance each Party's capacity to enforce its environmental laws and regulations, and will develop and strengthen their cooperative relationships to promote compliance, enforcement, and environmental performance. The activities that have been agreed upon are: (1) the delivery of a capacity building workshop on September 27-29, 2004, that will bring together attorneys from public agencies charged with the prosecution of administrative and/or judicial actions oriented to the enforcement of environmental legislation and (2) the implementation of an exchange program for their officials.
