Current State and Perspective on the Use of Drugs for Aquaculture Seminar	The Current State and Perspective on the Use of Drugs for Aquaculture seminar discussed current information on national programs for the promotion and regulation of aquaculture. A presenter from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) discussed human food safety evaluation of veterinary drugs in food (especially aquaculture foods), regulation of antimicrobial drugs for use in food animals, and control and use of veterinary drugs for aquaculture in the United States. The roundtable discussions focused on topics related to the safety of drugs to be used in aquaculture, problems related to the low number of drugs approved for aquaculture use, residues control programs in the USA, and issues related to the safety of the products being imported from Chile to the USA, Europe and Japan. U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) experts presented papers and spoke on topics such as the evaluation of human food safety by JECFA toxicology requirements update on the International Cooperation on Harmonization of Technical Requirements for Registration of Veterinary Products food safety working group residue chemistry and metabolism requirements and working procedures of Codex and JECFA.
