The delegation will also improve their knowledge of U.S. oil spill response and port security practices and technologies, including state-of-the-art containment and cleanup equipment and gamma-ray scanners and transportation security technology for port applications. Delegates will meet U.S. suppliers, national associations, and federal agencies such as Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Homeland Security and the U.S. Coast Guard during the visit.
