This technical assistance will help improve the effectiveness of Mongolian aviation communications, navigation, and surveillance and air traffic management systems. <b>Mongolia Timebound Program to Eliminate the Worst Forms of Child Labor</b>	This activity provides capacity to the Government of Mongolia to adhere to internationally recognized labor standards, including freedom from child labor, which is a requirement for receipt of U.S. trade benefits. Funded and implemented by Department of Labor/ILAB.	Human Resources & Labor Standards	<b>2,900,000</b>
<b>Trade Policy and Competitiveness</b>	The Trade Policy and Competitiveness Component of the Economic Policy Reform and Competitiveness (EPRC) planned activities include: (1) Access to Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) for Mongolian products, (2) analysis of the impact of the Multi-Fiber Agreement (MFA) on textile access to U.S. Markets and development of policy options, (3) negotiations on reduction of barriers to entry, (4) improved trade management capacity, and (5) assistance on FTAs, RTAs. Competitiveness EPRC works with firms and clusters in key sectors (e.g. cashmere, tourism, meat, and textiles) to develop export businesses. Activities include: (1) rapid assessment of key clusters and development of action plans, (2) establishment of a Competitiveness Fund, and (3) identification of market niches, and business development services. Status of on-going activities: Cashmere and tourism strategies, Meat and leather sector action, advice provided to individual firms in the tourism, cashmere, and leather sectors.
