Aceh Intermodal Transportation Strategy	The United States Trade and Development Agency is providing technical assistance (TA) to develop a medium-to-long-term intermodal transportation strategy for Aceh Province in Indonesia. This TA would address a growing concern of the Indonesian government on one aspect of its post-tsunami reconstruction effort: the lack of a long-term integrated vision for the transportation network in Aceh. This project would examine all sectors of the transportation network in Aceh, including the road, port, rail and aviation sectors, provide an effective strategy to integrate these various sectors, and recommend new investments. Regional competitiveness centers (RCCs) will be established with the goal to improve the productivity and competitiveness of small and medium enterprises in Indonesia. Advocacy activities will focus on removing constraints to growth and prosperity. Regional competitiveness alliances (RCAs), coordinated by RCCs, will work with existing associations, coalitions, members of regional and national government, and community leaders to improve the business environment. Financial Crime Prevention Project - Indonesia	Financial Crime Prevention Project (FCPP), by the U.S. Agency for International Development, is a four-year activity designed to strengthen the ability of Indonesia to combat financial crimes. FCPP provides technical assistance to the Financial Intelligence Unit, Supreme Audit Commission (BPK), Office of the Attorney General, Corruption Eradication Commission, and the Ministry of Finance-Inspector General Office. The FCPP aids efforts by Indonesia to build a modern legal and institutional framework to fight corruption and financial crimes. Results: (1) Financial Action Task Force (FATF) removes Indonesia from its direct monitoring list. (2) The Indonesian Mutual Legal Assistance law is enacted. (3) Creation of an investigative audit unit within the Supreme Audit Board. (4) Develop a white paper for Ministry of Finance Inspectorate General on their authority to conduct investigation. The capacity for strategic policy and operational technical assistance, using an extensive network of senior-level volunteers, has delivered practical and timely support. The project has contributed to the development of strategically important institutions, including Bank Indonesia, the Supreme Audit Board, the Capital Market Supervisory Authority (Bapepam), the Deposit Insurance Agency (LPS), PT Sarana Multigriya Financial (SMF), and the new Secondary Mortgage Corporation.
