Enhance Competitiveness of Export Sector - Mozambique	<p>The government of Mozambique will use the funding to support the expansion of exports through an effective trade policy and a supportive business environment. Mozambique will try to accomplish these goals through education in trade matters, special assistance to overcome market entry barriers to particular markets, (e.g. to help comply with sanitary and phytosanitary issues), and more general development of policies that maximize the growth and poverty reduction impact of trade policy. The key will be a technical assistance and training package for the government of Mozambique, aimed at improving the understanding of trade issues, and the capacity to negotiate and implement complex trade agreements. The training will assist the government in special trade analysis, data collection and the preparation of policy and negotiation briefs. Short-term training will be directed mainly, but not exclusively, at government officials involved in trade decision-making.
