Agriculture and Natural Resource Management Program	Since 2003, USAID promotes trade through the Agriculture and Natural Resource Management Program that targets nontraditional agricultural and natural products. In 2005, the markets for fonio (a native grain), Karaya gum (a pharmaceutical ingredient), baobab, madd, and jujube (local fruits) were strengthened, leading to revenues of \$250,000 in FY 2005 for 717 enterprises. Revenues of all informal enterprises totaled \$100,906 (an average of \$151 per enterprise) compared to \$77,714 last year, representing a 130 percent increase. Revenues for 40 emerging enterprises this year was \$207,105 (representing an average of \$5,178 per enterprise) while last year total revenue for this group was only \$58,083, representing an increase of 257 percent. The total volume of all marketed products rose from 434.6 tons to 1,010 tons during the year. In total, 245 metric tons of fonio, baobab, and karaya gum were exported, generating \$161,091 in new profits for 469 local beneficiaries. Funded and implemented by USAID/Senegal. 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Multi Commodity Port Complex	The United States Trade and Development Agency (USTDA) is funding a feasibility study that will provide the Government of Senegal an updated and expanded economic, financial, and legal analysis of a new multi-commodity port complex to be located south of Dakar. The study grant to the Société des Mines de Fer du Sénégal Oriental (Miferso), a state-owned project development company, represents the goal of USTDA to encourage transportation infrastructure development in Sub-Saharan Africa. The \$250 million new port complex could be constructed in order to serve multiple purposes, such as an export terminal for Senegalese mining products, an import terminal for bulk materials, and as a port of call for a new industrial zone being developed outside of the capital city of Dakar. Additionally, a new port complex would help decongest the Port of Dakar. Funded and implemented by Trade and Development Agency.	Physical Infrastructure Development	326,420

Port Projects - Matam Phosphate Transport	The activity funds a feasibility study that will be used by the Direction des Mines of the Senegalese Ministry of Energy and Mines to analyze the cost of various transportation alternatives for phosphate from the Matam phosphate deposits. The study of alternative transportation solutions will enable the Government of Senegal, as well as potential investors, to determine the economic viability of the Matam deposits.
