| Colombian Agribusiness Partnership Program (CAPP) | The Colombian Agricultural Partnership Program (CAPP) assists agribusinesses primarily by identifying qualified private sector partners, the careful evaluation of proposed projects, and the application of mechanisms for assistance tailored specifically to requirements of the project. Each activity must have a technical assistance package managed by the CAPP enterprise at the producer level and every other level to ensure products are handled properly. While all CAPP activities must be market driven, technical assistance must be provided to ensure that the most efficient, and therefore profitable, business operations are established. A total of 34 agribusiness projects totaling \$204 million have been approved for implementation, with a total U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) contribution of only \$24 million.
