Promoting these products, increasing value-added production, and creating market linkages is helping protect the biodiversity of Madagascar. The sector is improving production practices and is provided with alternatives to slash and burn techniques. USAID also provides technical assistance to farmers, agribusiness associations, and companies specializing in natural and biological products. Ecotourism development activities support the National Park Network. USAID assistance consists of training tour operators, development of norms and standards to ecotourism site development, and promotion of Madagascar as an ecotourism destination.
