<b>Trade Capacity Building in Panama</b>	The Trade Capacity Building (TCB) project implements and operates an assistance window that builds upon previous activities to help enhance export capacity and competitiveness of small- and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). The facility works with the private sector with support from the Government of Panama. Results to date include: (1) shrimp, dairy and teak market reports, (2) guide on e-tourism, (3) reports on food safety for export, and on competitiveness, (4) technical assistance window for SMEs, a manual for the operation of the window, and three launching events to promote it, (5) established process for selecting proposals to receive technical assistance, and selected 24 proposals after receiving 54, (9) initiated development of individual project strategies and budgets for 24 projects, and (10) initiated process for collecting company contributions and managing the cost-sharing component of the project.
